



## Echo360 Video Transcripts

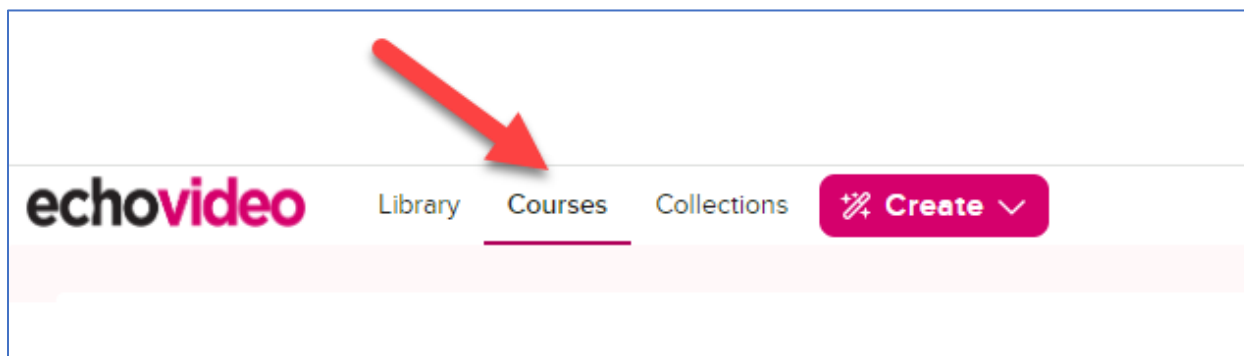
The current Echo360 setting at Qatar University allows you to enable **ASR (Automatic Speech Recognition)** for any course on your Echo 360 account. The steps to enable ASR for your course on Echo360 are listed below.

Kindly note the following before you move on:

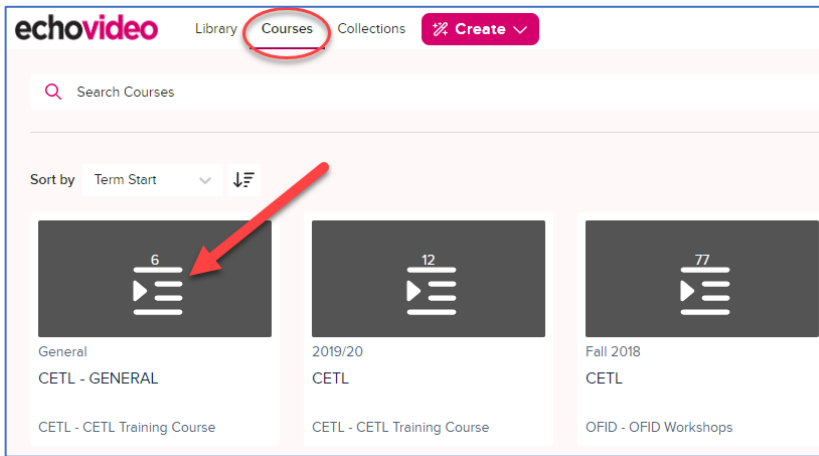
- Any new video that you publish to the course (after enabling ASR) will have transcripts generated. It takes at least 30 minutes for a video to receive automatic transcriptions. It takes longer for videos that are more than an hour in length, or if the transcription service is processing a large number of requests at the same time.
- Older videos, that were published before enabling the ASR, will not have automatic transcripts. They should be re-published to the class/course to have the transcripts generated.
- Transcripts can be generated in different languages. You need to specify the language for each course in the ASR settings.

### How to enable ASR for your Echo360 course.

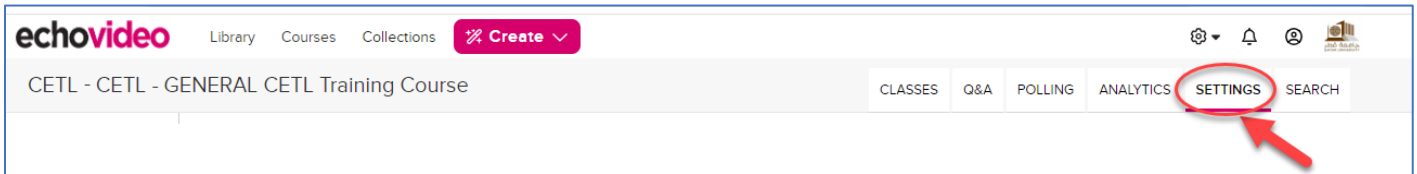
1- In Echo 360, click on the courses tab



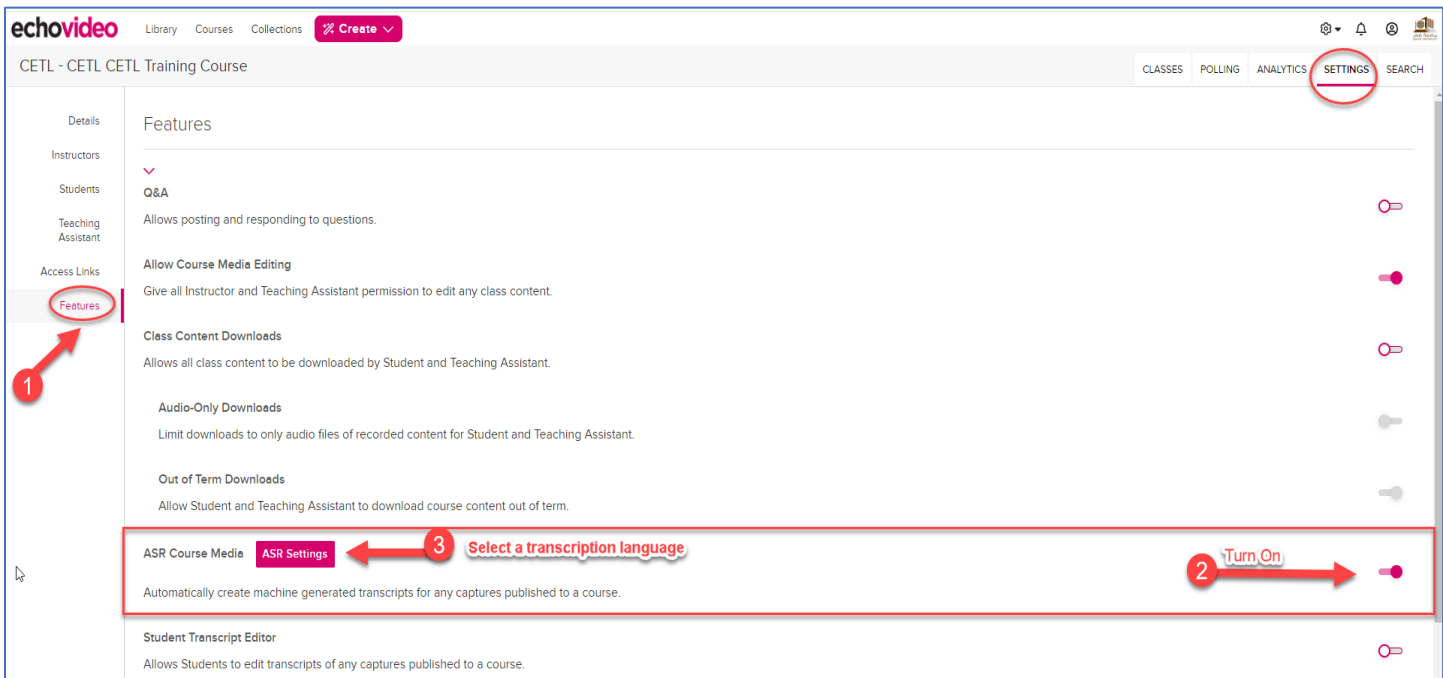
2- In the **courses** page, select the course that you want to enable transcripts for.



3- Within the course window,  
1) click **“settings”** at the right top of the page.

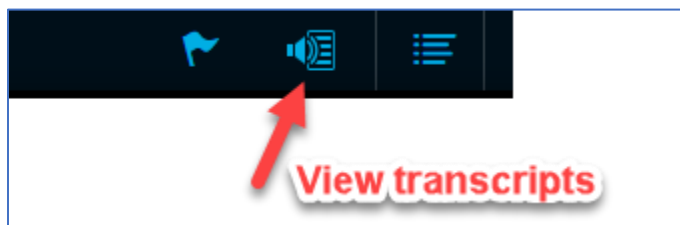


4- In the **settings** page of the course:  
1) Select **“Features”** from the left menu.  
2) **Turn on** the **“ASR Course Media”**.  
3) Click **“ASR Settings”**, and choose the transcription language.



## Viewing Transcriptions

Whenever you publish a new video to this course, transcripts will be generated. Wait at least 30 minutes before checking for transcripts. Once the transcript is ready, you and your students will see a new icon added to the video published in **Echo360 course**. Click on it to view the transcription.



You and your students can also view the transcription if the **video is embedded in Blackboard**. A new icon will appear for viewing transcripts.



**Note** that transcripts will be available for embedded videos that had already been published to an Echo360 course with ASR enabled.
